Information for guardians within Ludvika preschools and schools 200908.

The semester has started in the best way, where management, staff, children and guardians yes everyone, take their responsibility, hold on and hold out and work together based on the prevailing covid-19 situation. Based on the above, we would like to highlight that the Swedish Public Health Agency, through Karin Tegmark Wisell, states "that children and young people feel good about participating in school and other everyday activities" and based on this, the Swedish Public Health Agency has developed a new guide for sampling of students from preschool up to grade nine.

The guidelines state that:

Preschool children are recommended to return to preschool when they have been perfectly healthy for at least two days, 48 hours. If the child is perceived to be healthy but still has a little cough or is a bit snotty, it should have been at least 7 days since the child first became ill and that the child should have felt healthy for 2 days before returning to preschool. Covid-19 tests are not conducted on preschool children.

School students are recommended to be tested for covid-19 if the student exhibits symptoms.

In case of positive response, the student should be at home for at least 7 days since the first symptoms and felt refreshed and healthy without fever for two days, 48 hours before returning to school.

In case of negative response, the student can return to school as soon as he feels fit, healthy and does not have a fever.

If the student has not taken a covid-19 test, the student can go to school after being completely healthy for two days, 48 hours. If the student is perceived to be healthy but still has a little cough or is a bit snotty, it should have been at least 7 days since the student first became ill and that the student should have felt healthy for 2 days, 48 hours before returning to school.

Parent meetings and development talks

Preschool and school will not hold any parent meetings during the autumn.

The school will invite development talks for all students, but implementation will take place in alternative ways and with alternative communication tools.

Preschool prepares development talks for all children in Unikum. The talks will then be conducted based on the need of children, staff and your guardian, so some will have talks during the autumn but most will be invited to talks in the spring. Even the preschool can also offer talks via alternative means and with alternative communication tools.
