

Information from the Administration regarding Covid-19

On September 29, new restrictions came regarding Covid-19, the society opened up, more and more, we have the opportunity to participate in events and meet in larger groups. But FHM writes on its website that it is essential that everyone who has the opportunity is vaccinated to prevent it from spreading in society.

What does it mean for preschool, and how does it affect us in preschool.

- It is crucial that we all, staff, guardians, and children continue to follow the public health authority's current restrictions regarding symptoms. Everyone still has a great responsibility to avoid infection.
- In case of symptoms, staff, children, and guardians should not stay at the preschool if children show symptoms, the preschool contacts the guardian.
- In case of symptoms, the child needs to stay at home as long as he, she has symptoms and another two days that should be complete without symptoms.
- After seven days, the child can go back to preschool even if they still have mild symptoms such as a slight cough or a slight runny nose. For the last two days, the child must have been without a fever and otherwise been healthy.
- Routines for handwashing will remain in the preschools. Here you can also help to wash your and your children's hands with soap and water before you come to preschool.
- Teaching will continue to be mainly conducted outdoors.
- The preschool is a workplace, and the risk of being exposed to infection remains for our staff. All preschools regularly review their routines, which means that the preschools will have different routines for, for example, picking up and dropping off children.
- Development talks will be offered during the autumn, digitally or on-site, depending on the preschool's opportunity for spaces.
- - Parent information in a large group is expected by the administration until the spring of 2022.
